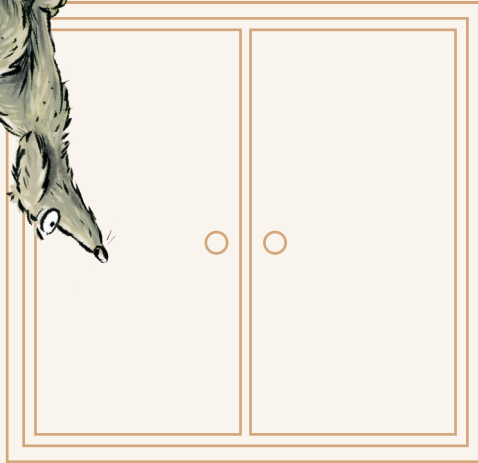
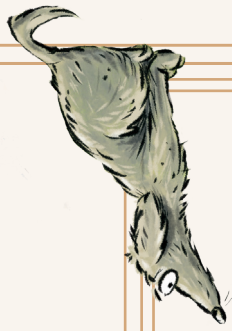

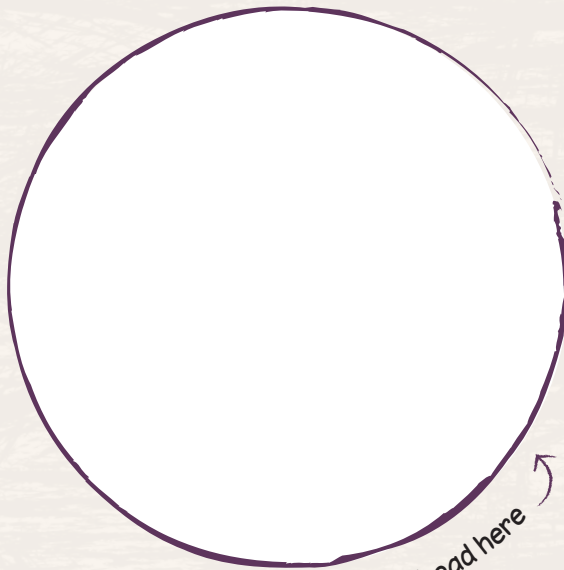
Soldiers had to look after their own pieces of kit.
